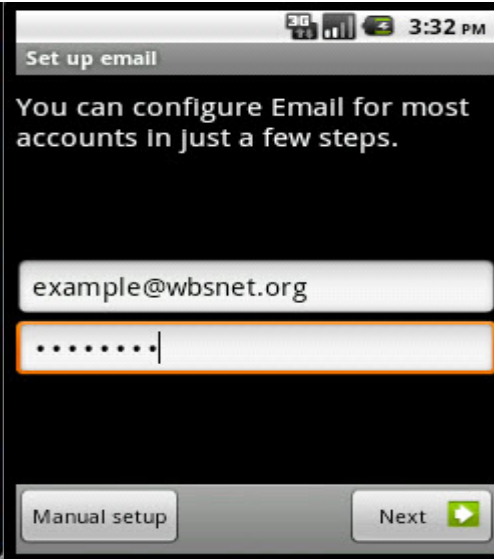

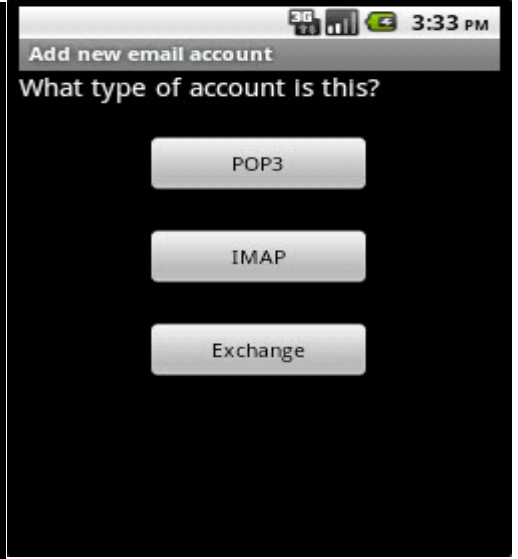

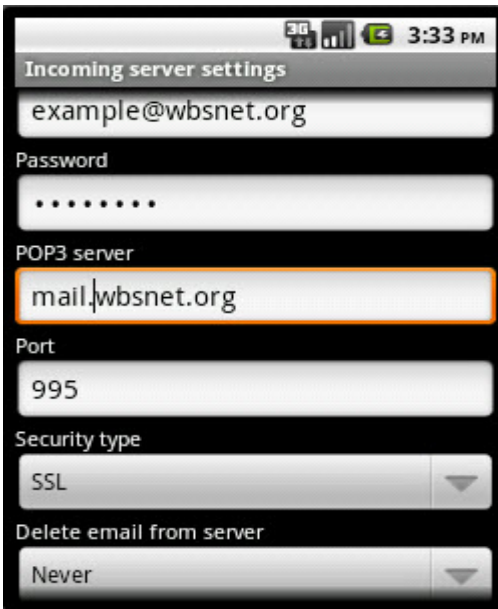
Step 1: Tap the Email Icon.

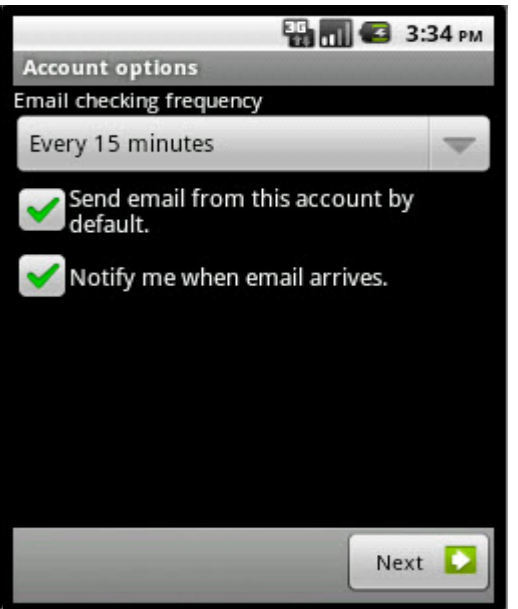

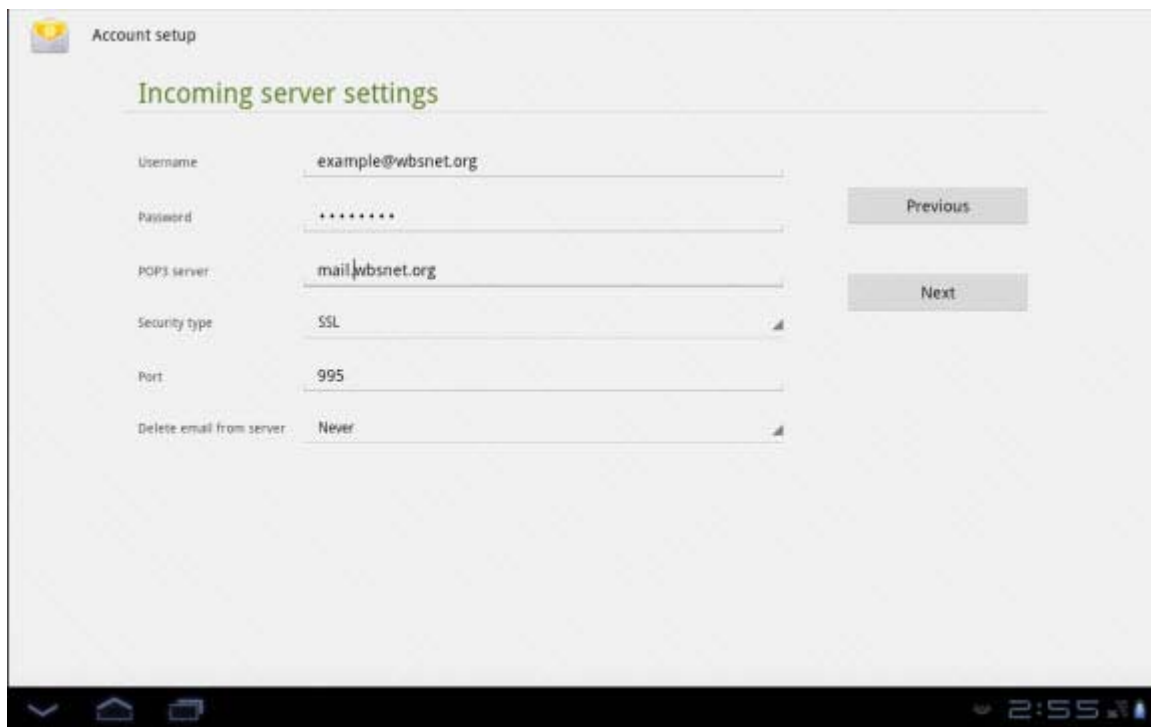
Step 1: Click on Email Icon.



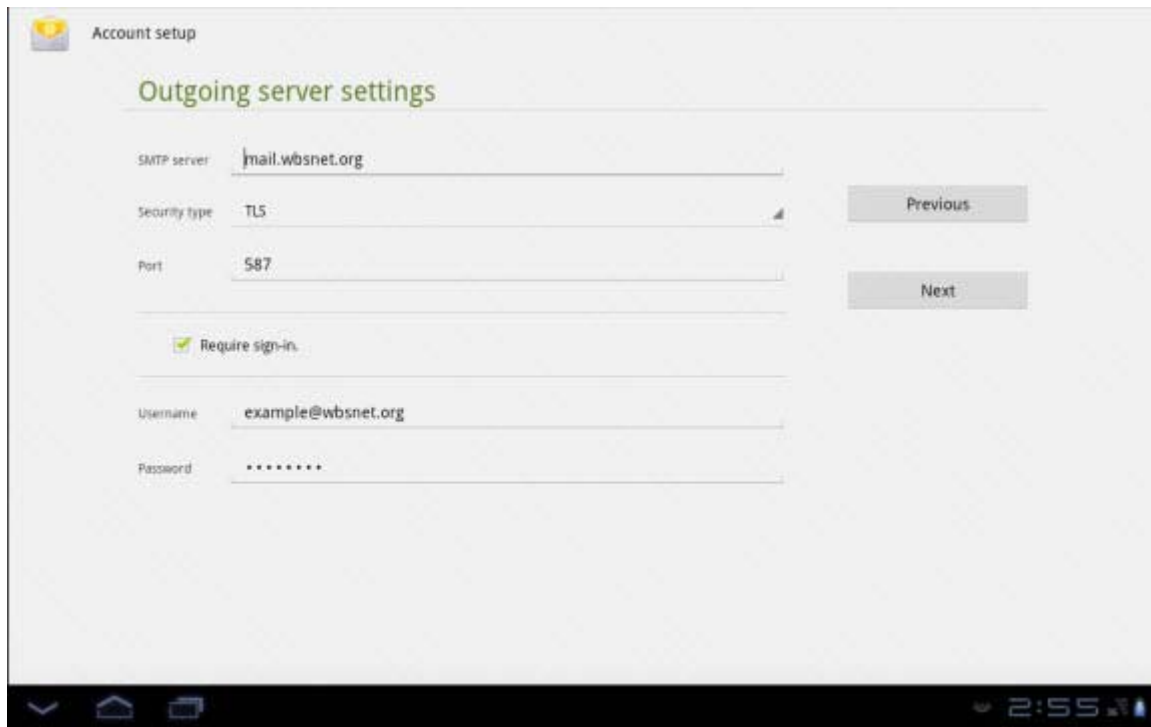
Step 2: Fill out customers Email/password, click Manual Setup.



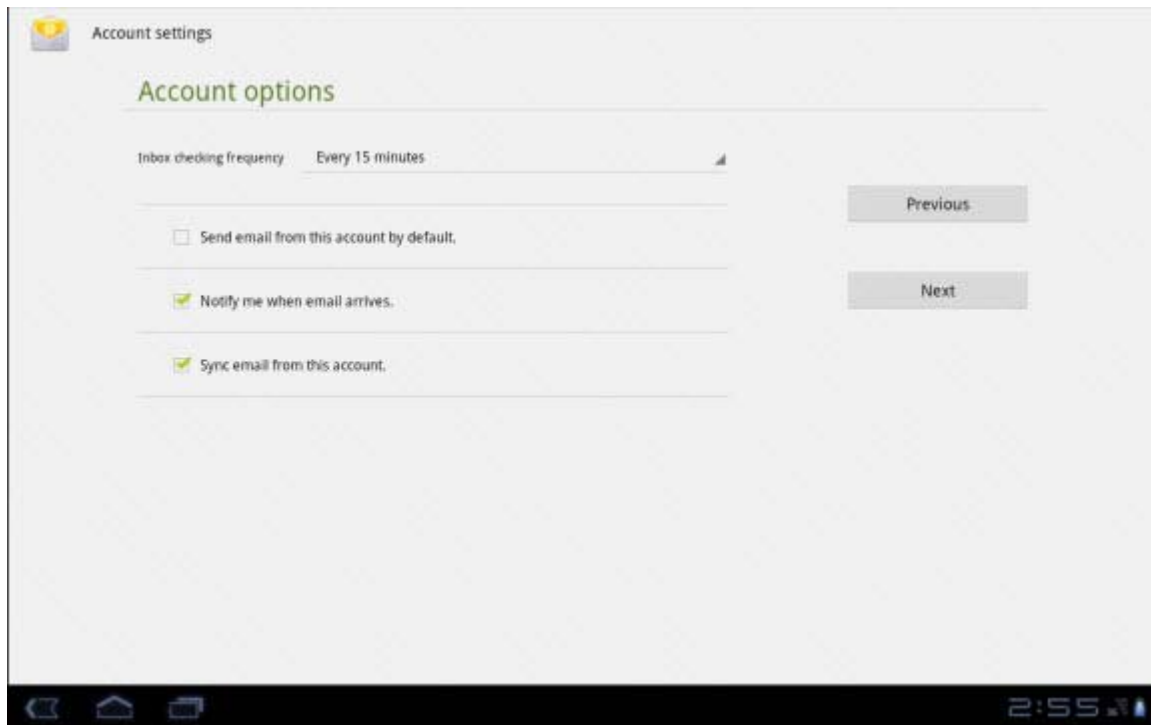
Step 3: Select POP3 or IMAP.



Step 4: Fill out incoming settings. Use customer email/password.

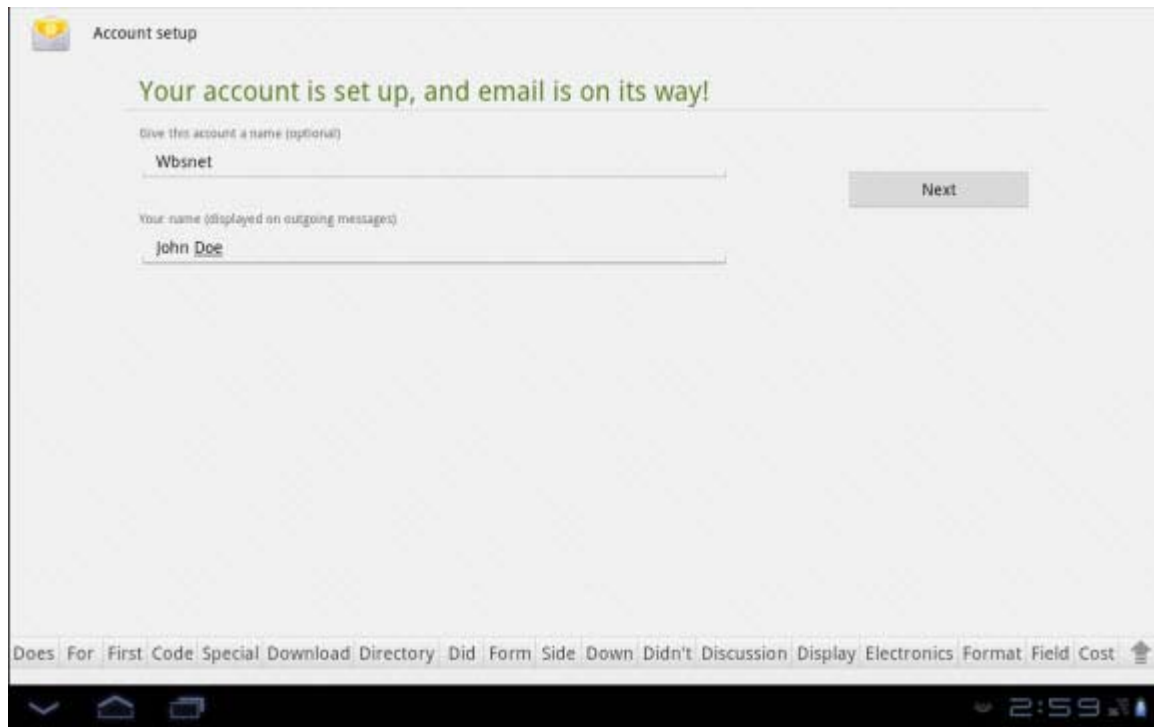


Step 5: fill out outgoing server settings. Use Customer email/password.



Step 6: Verify with customer what frequency/default settings they want to use.

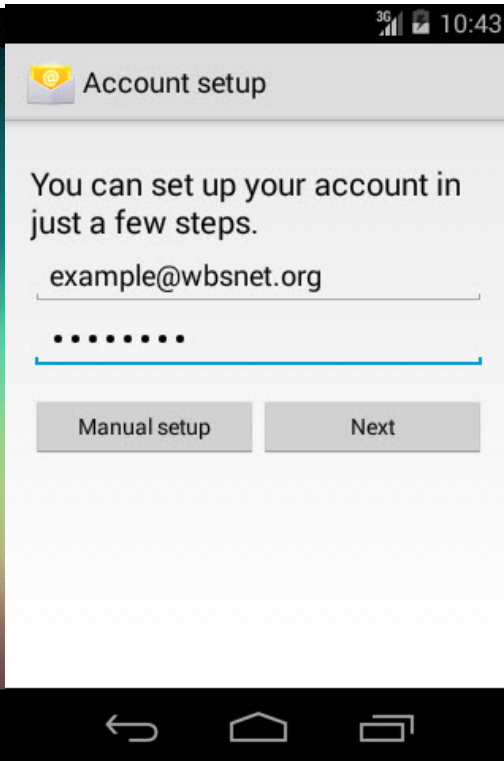
- Frequency is how often the mail is checked while idle.
- “send email from this account by default” uses this email as default.



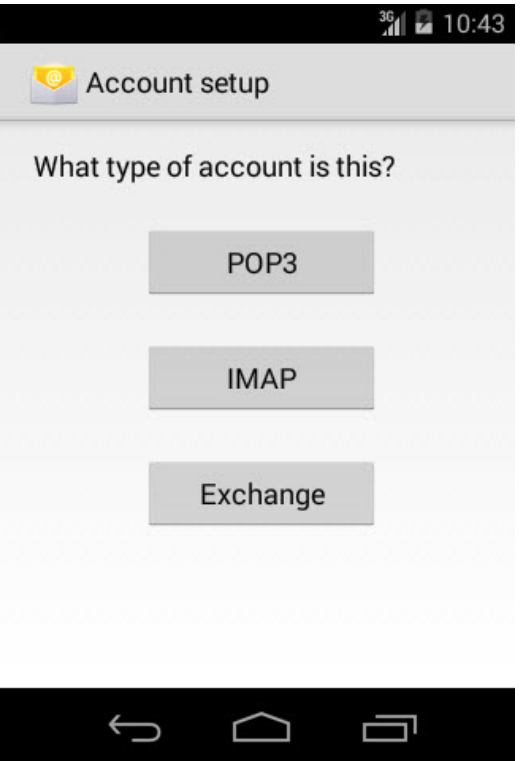
Step 7: Name the account and fill out display name per customer.



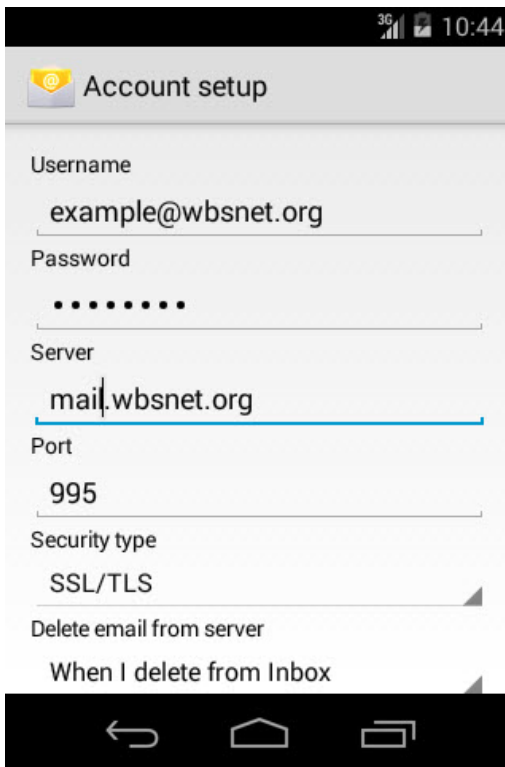
